BACKGROUND















PRIMARY PLAY IN A DAY

One day performance project for 10 primary schools across 4 towns.

Key messages of Saltscape through drama, games and music.

Hands on approach to learning, inclusive of all abilities.

Link with partners such as Polli:Nation to share outcomes.

Outcomes

Each child will perform a in play, in costume.

Performance for the whole school and parents at the end of the day.

Opportunity to develop a larger primary project for Summer 17

DRAGONFLY TRAIL

Live interactive performance piece, accessed through a map

Walkabout performers and 5 performance locations

Inspired by the location and site visits, delivered using multi-artforms

Based on the community woodland trail

Developed through 10 weekly sessions with dance and drama groups.

Outcomes

Public performance in Saltscape site

Linking together community arts groups

Engaging general public to think about site in a creative way

Digital archive and legacy

SALTSCAPE SESSIONS

Mid Cheshire College Drama, Dance and Music students.

Supported by Artist and MMU student placements.

30-40 minutes of original composition, devised for end of term performances.

Inspired by: A visit to Lion Salt Works Museum

Oral histories

Folk music

Outcomes

18th March Salt Saturday 23rd March Event at Lion Salt Works 27th March Event at Mid Cheshire College

SUMMER WOODLANDS PANTO

Developed across 1 term with students from Petty Pool College Creative Industries group.

Using Drama, Music and Dance to create a outdoor production

Inspired by:

The work they have done with Saltscape so far Their woodlands- Conservation Comedy Characters and Music

Outcomes

Public performance for friends family and invited Animate groups.

Chance to work across the curriculum with other classes.

STARLINGS PROJECT

Working with MMU lecturers and students

Record Starling murmurations at Marbury park and using this as inspiration to create original artwork

Using a range of artforms and outcomes.

Outcomes

Recorded artwork for online content
Linking individual artists to communities
Possibility for development of larger sharings/public performances
at both MMU and community venues.

SALT'N' STEAM

A fun walkabout theatre piece, inspired by local stories, histories and landscape.

Presented by a troupe of actor/improvisors

Steampunk bicycle full of instruments and props

'Wherever we stop is our stage'

Working with a group of up to 10 University students

Outcomes

Family friendly piece that is fun, portable and able to engage large numbers at public events.

WORKSHOP PROGRAMME

Stand alone arts workshops for local community groups using drama, poetry, movement or crafts

Visits to places of local interest The natural landscape/ Language Other artwork from Animate!
