THE SALTSCAPE TRAIL devised by Friends of Anderton and Marbury and funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund, was launched last month. It links Anderton Boat Lift and Lion Salt Works passing through the beautiful surroundings of Northwich Woodlands. Visitors can choose the Orchid trail or the Dragonfly trail (3 miles each), both of which link existing and upgraded footpaths to create a full figure-of-eight walk.
